What do I ask my child when Reading?

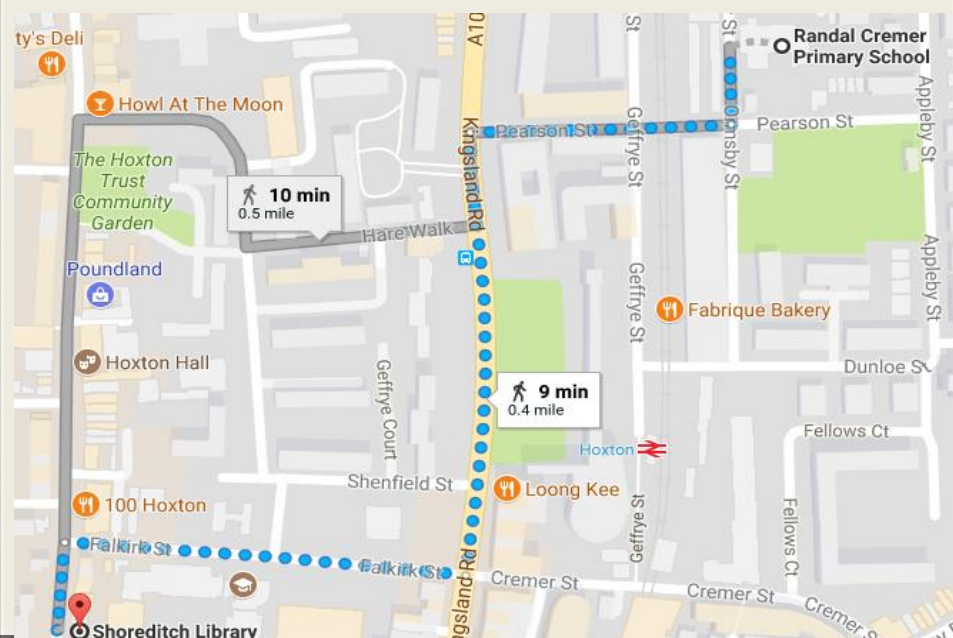
- Where does the story take place? (setting)
- Who are the main characters in the story?
- Can you retell the story using your own words?
- What do you think the character feels about...? How can you tell?
- What do you think would have happened if...?
- What do you think is going to happen next? Can you guess the ending?
- Do you know any more stories like this? Tell me how they are alike.
- Do you know another story with similar characters in? Tell me how they are similar.
- Has anything like this ever happened to you?

If you need this information in another language, please let your child's teacher know.
