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We believe that the wearing of a school uniform enables children to identify with their school, gives a sense of belonging, is practical and smart, reinforces a positive work ethos and reduces expenditure for parents/carers.”

All children/pupils are expected to wear the appropriate school uniform everyday:
All uniform, including coats must be labeled clearly with the child’s name and class.

EYFS

Winter:

- Navy Blue school issued sweatshirt, cardigan or fleece
- Plain white polo shirt or blouse
- Black /grey tracksuit bottoms or skirt
- White/black socks or tights
- Black shoes or trainers.

Tracksuit bottoms or jeans are not part of school uniform.

Summer:

- As above or red/white or blue/white checked dress or black/grey shorts

Year 1 to Year 5

Winter:

- Navy Blue school issued sweatshirt, cardigan or fleece
- Plain white polo shirt or blouse
- Black /grey trousers or skirt
- White/black socks or tights
- Black shoes or trainers.

Tracksuit bottoms or jeans are not part of school uniform.

Summer:

- As above or red/white or blue/white checked dress or black/grey shorts

Year 6

- Red school issued sweatshirt
- Red/Blue Striped tie issued by school
- Plain white shirt or blouse
- Black /grey trousers or skirt
- White/black socks or tights
- Black shoes or trainers.



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Summer:

- As above or red/white or blue/white checked dress or black/grey shorts

Jewellery

- Stud or small sleeper ear-rings are permitted. These will need to be removed for swimming and pupils will have to take responsibility for looking after their own.
- A sensible wrist watch. Gimmicky or watches with gadgets are not permitted.
- No bracelets, rings or necklaces. We take the safety of our pupils very seriously and necklaces and bracelets can easily get caught in hair or strangle a child when they are playing outside. Rings can also cause injury either intentionally or on purpose.

Headscarves:

- Head scarves or other hair coverings are permitted but should be plain black or white. They should only be the type that is easy to slip on or off and not need pins to hold it in place.
- Children must remove their headscarves for PE.

Any child not wearing school uniform will have a letter sent home. Should the parents fail to respond, a meeting will be arranged between the parent and a member of SLT.
